#### **LONDON**

Basic facts/ Tell me some facts about London

London is <u>the capital</u> of the United Kingdom. It is one of the biggest cities in Europe. About <u>9 million people live there</u>.

It is a *muticultural* [maltikalč-rl] city, with over 300 different languages spoken.

<u>The Queen/</u> Elizabeth II (the second) <u>lives and</u> <u>works there</u>, in Buckingham palace.



London <u>is located in southern England</u>.

Britain is <u>made up of England</u> in the south,


<u>Scotland</u> in the north <u>and Wales</u> [weils] in the west.

<u>The river Thames</u> [temz] <u>flows</u> between North and South London.

## The History

<u>The first people who came to Britain</u> were <u>the</u>
<u>Romans</u> in the year 43. They built roads, buildings and created the town. They named it <u>Londinium</u>.

After them Anglo-Saxon warriors came to England and stayed from 5<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> century, their language



In 1666 <u>the Great Fire of London burnt the town down.</u> Many parts of London were destroyed completely. We can see it in paintings, a lot of writers wrote about it.




## The national symbols of London & Great Britain

The national symbols of Britain and London are <u>the British</u> flag called <u>Union Jack</u>, the red <u>double decker buses</u>, <u>black</u> taxi cars called <u>Black</u> cabs,

<u>Royal guardsmen</u> by Buckingham Palace, with black hats called <u>Bearskin</u> (the officers's hats are made of brown Canadian bear skin/fur [f'] as the brown bear's fur is thicker. They dye it black =barví na černo), other symbols



If you go to London, you should take a photo of <u>Big Ben</u> (it is only a nick name of the bell inside the Elizabethen clock tower, people think it is the tower) and <u>the Houses of Parliament</u> (also known as <u>Westminster Palace</u> with gothic church <u>Westminster Abbys</u> [ebi]), <u>Buckingham Palace</u> (the official residence of the Queen), <u>The British Museum</u> where you can see artefacts from all over the world, <u>The National Gallery</u> (with the world's most famous paintings by Van Gogh, a self- portrait by Rembrandt, and others), <u>The Tower of London</u> which used to be a prison and where you can see the Crown Jewels, or <u>The Tower Bridge</u> (that opens in the middle). Tourists like <u>St (saint) Paul's Cathedrale</u>,

## Entertainment/ What can you do in London?

You can do a lot of touristic activities: see the <u>Sea Life London Aquarium</u>, <u>Wembley Stadium</u>, go on the London Eye</u>, walk along the River Thames. You should visit <u>Buckingham Palace</u>, see the Changing of the Guards, visit museums <u>and sights</u>, for example <u>Madame Tussaud</u> [tuzó] <u>museum</u>, a museum of wax figurines. Tourists love shopping in Oxford Street, Camden Market or at <u>Covent</u> <u>Garden</u> in London. There are <u>many markets</u> where you can buy fruit and vegetables, exotic foods, interesting clothes or just enjoy the atmosphere. London is <u>famous for its parks</u>, such as <u>Hyde Park</u>, Regent's Park, Green Park on one side of Buckingham Palace, <u>St James's Park</u> on the other side, with large lake and a lot of ducks and birds, <u>Greenwich Park</u> (with <u>a famous observatory and planetarium</u>) and <u>Kensington Gardens</u>.

#### **Covent Garden**

In the 17<sup>th</sup> century Covent Garden <u>was the</u> <u>biggest and most important flower, fruit and</u> <u>vegetable market in Britain</u>. There were <u>illegal</u> <u>boxing matches</u> there and it wasn't safe to drink water there, it was not healthy. People



drank beer or gin after work, it was a <u>dangerous</u> place. In Covent Garden there is <u>the oldest restaurant in London</u>, it has been open since 1798. Today there are <u>many shops and boutiques</u>, they are very expensive, you can have a cup of coffee [kofi] in the local cafés [kafés] (kavárny), or watch <u>buskers</u> (that are street artists, street performers).

### **Public transport**

London has famous red <u>double decker buses</u>, taxi cars called <u>black cabs</u>, you can travel by <u>the Underground</u> called <u>the tube (there are over 270 stations on the tube!)</u>, or from London you can take a <u>train</u>. The Eurostar gies from St Pancras Station through a tunnel under the English Channel to Paris and to Europe.

### **Buckingham Palace**

Buckingham Palace is a <u>place where the Queen lives and works</u>. It is <u>like a small</u> <u>town</u>, there is a hospital, police station, cinema, sports centre and other things in it. King George III bought the building for his wife Queen Charlotte in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, in 1761. It is open to visitors every summer. There are about 800



rooms - 19 State rooms, 52 Royal and guest bedrooms, 188 staff bedrooms, 92 offices and 78 bathrooms. Tourists can see some parts of the Palace, visit

some rooms, it's like a chateau [šató](zámek). You can also get

married there/ have a wedding in the Palace.

In front of Buckingham Palace there's a statue of Queen

Victoria.

King Charles III is the current/ present ruling monarch of the

United Kingdom and 14 Commonwealth countries. He acceded [@ksí-dyd] )nastoupil na trůn) to the throne aged 73 when his mother Queen Elizabeth II died in September 2022. He studied architecture, some of the terraced gardens by Prague Castle were built according to his designs/ plans.



Queen Elizabeth II was born in 1926. She <u>was 92 years</u> <u>old when she died</u>. She was <u>the Queen of the United</u> <u>Kingdom and</u> other Commonwealth countries – such as

Canada, New Zealand, Australia, South Africa, Pakistan and Ceylon. Queen

Elizabeth II <u>took the throne</u> at crazy times after her father King George VI died

aged 56 in 1952. At that time, she was <u>only 25 years old!!</u> (Imagine at the age of 25 the responsibility of running a country, or more likely four!!! The Queen did not expect to become the Queen. Her uncle, Prince Edward inherited the throne, but when Elizabeth was 10, he abdicated to marry a divorced lover, an American celebrity.) Queen Elizabeth died aged 96 in her Balmoral Castle in Scotland. She was the longest ruling woman-monarch on the throne.



## The Royal Family

The Queen was married to Prince Phillip, the Duke of Edinburgh, he was 96 years old when he died. The Queen had 4 children, Prince Charles, Prince Andrew, Prince Edward and Princess Anne. Prince Charles has been married

twice, to Princess Diana, who died in a car crash in 1997, they had two children, Prince William and Prince Harry, and to Camilla Bowles, who became Queen Consort (choť).
