

Catch Dental Caries **Before It's Too Late!**

Stage one — slight

Acid produced by sugar-loving bacteria in plaque start to erode tooth enamel. This leads to the formation of small cavities in pits and fissures in the biting surfaces of teeth. At this point, there are no symptoms. The cavities are painless.

Stage two - minor

'The cavity deepens until it reaches the underlying dentin, and then it begins to spread. The patient will begin to feel some sensitivity when eating hot, cold or sweet foods and drinks.

Stage three — advanced

The cavity spreads further and begins to weaken the tooth. There may be some discoloration and pain.

Stage four — severe

The tooth is now very weak. Fractures may develop when biting down, especially if the cavity is under a filling. The tooth may break altogether. Root canal procedures are necessary to prevent the spread of infection in the dental pulp.
